FMCA UPDATE - FMCA Dues Increase

At the FMCA Convention in August, the Governing Board approved an annual dues increase of \$10.00. This is the first dues increase since 2010. In addition to some minor projected increases in operational cost, the Governing Board supported shifting the expense of FMC Assist from investment income to an Operational Expense. FMC Assist, the medical and travel assistance program, will continue to be included as a part of your annual dues. Other organizations charge over \$100.00 annually per coach for essentially the same coverage. By approving the \$10.00 increase at this time, the FMCA staff and Executive Board projects that another increase will not be forthcoming for several more years. Upcoming FMCA Conventions from now on, the FMCA gatherings will all be referred to as Conventions instead of Reunions.

A record 5000 assistance dogs have been trained and placed through CCI since 1975, all of those provided at no cost to the client. Secretary's Report.

Secretary Pro Tem, Nancy Baumgart, stated that the minutes of the General Meeting held April 4, 2016 at Pueblo El Mirage RV & Golf Resort, El Mirage, AZ were published in the most recent newsletter. President Knud asked for additions or corrections to the newsletter. Being none, he called for a motion to accept the minutes as published. A motion was made, seconded, and passed.

Treasurer's Report.

New Business.

Tom Getzfrid stated that he would like to present a motion to the membership regarding changing our existing Bylaws to include downsizing and lifestyle changes as well as accepting other diesel Class A motorhomes other than Monacos. Tom’s proposal included three options to be voted upon. Jeff Preach seconded the motion. It was pointed out by Susan Lewis that changes cannot be made to our Bylaws, only to our Standing Rules.

Also, on the same subject, Jim Lewis proposed an amendment to our Standing Rules to add a new category of membership – Associate Member. The amendment reads as follows:

“Due to lifestyle changes, a member may find it necessary to replace their coach in order to continue the RV lifestyle they enjoy. If they have been members in good standing for a minimum of three years and purchase any Class A motorhome, they can become an Associate Member with the right to attend all rallies and meetings but may not vote nor hold office.”

After much discussion, Tom Getzfrid and Jeff Preach withdrew their motion and second. It was decided that Knud will form a committee which includes Tom Getzfrid to look into this issue. This committee will present their recommendations to the board at a future meeting.


Duncan Holt presented his resignation as Vice President due to recently purchasing an Entegra Diesel Motorhome.

FMCA National Directors Report

Governing Board Meeting...August 3, 2016...West Springfield, Massachusetts

A quorum was announced. The Western Area was represented by 24% of our chapters. The workbook used this year was 46 pages in length and contained the usual Reports, Amendments, and Proposals that required our votes. The pre-registered attendance was announced as being 1,059 with 246 Display Coaches (1,305 total).

National Treasurers Report - Percy Bell, National Treasurer, reported the following regarding FMCA's finances as of May 31, 2016, at the 8th month mark in fiscal year 2016:

1. FMCA is showing a operating profit of \$81,539 compared to a budgeted operating profit of \$33,955.
2. Revenues for the period are \$4,395,657 compared to a budget of \$4,831,323.
3. Expenses are \$4,314,118 against a budget of 4,797,368. We are operating under budget in the expense areas by \$483,250 and expenses are under the prior year by \$84,256.
4. The balance sheet remains strong with \$460,839 of cash in the banks.
5. The investment account is \$7,940,200.
6. FMC Assist Medical Evacuation Program is being funded each month from the earnings of the investment account. In the past eight months we have had to withdraw \$410,279 to fund this initiative.

Membership at June 20, 2016 was reported as being 70,049 members. The rate of loss has decreased, and during the first half of 2016, we have experienced a membership increase in five out of the last six months

The Executive Board in their May meeting voted to enter into a \$250,000 working association with RVillage, a social network for RVers. FMCA is going to integrate RVillage with the marketing efforts of our research firm Membership Corporation of America (MCA), who highly recommended this initiative.

Voting Issues:

Policy and Procedure Amendments (3 total)

P & P #1015 Membership Enrollment: ¥ This amendment was made to streamline marketing language as well as mailing costs. This Proposal Passed

P & P #2023 Area vice President's Responsibilities: ¥ This amendment reverses the 2015 decision regarding residency requirements. It states that the Area VP must live in the area he/she is President of. This Proposal passed.

P & P #2031 Reimbursement of Travel Costs for Individuals Traveling on Official Business: ¥ This amendment was made to satisfy audit committee request that all expenses claimed for reimbursements shall be documented with original paid receipts. This Proposal passed.

Special Committee Reports:

Special Committee reports were read to the delegates by their Chairman's. They were: Commercial Council, Membership/Member Services Committee, Risk Management, and Youth Program.

Special Note:

Of special interest, and will see article in October issue of the FMCA magazine. The Governing Board passed a motion to allow the Executive Board to supervise the process of amending the FMCA Articles of Incorporation to be revised as broadly as possible, to avoid an overly restricted Constraint on FMCA's mission (which may evolve over time) and activities in serving the needs and expectations of its members. The articles were signed in 1971 and have never been revised. A ballot, which will be placed in the October magazine, must be voted on by the Membership and returned no later than December 31, 2016.

FMCA has developed a Call Center in the Cincinnati office that will be calling all members prior to their dues coming due, this we hope will significantly reduce the numbers of members dropping their membership in FMCA.

The search of the next Executive Director will begin in January 2017.
