## Gillette, Wyoming Convention

Monaco International (MI) had a pre-rally from 7/11-14 with Wilma Jean Alexander, President of MI, as Wagon Master. The rally was excellent. All coaches had full hookups and did not have to move for the following FMCA convention. The food was outstanding and there was great entertainment each evening. Also, there were interesting seminars, lots of vendors, and RV service available.



Following was the 98<sup>th</sup> FMCA International Convention from 7/18-21 with a full program of vendors, seminars and entertainment. There were 1753 RV's attending, of which 217 were commercial and 497 were first timers. Eight Monaco Romer members attended the Gillette rallies.

## Governing Board Meeting

The governing board was run by president Jon Walker. Members were given booklets and a "President's State of the Association report" with the following highlights:

- FMCA membership peaked in 2004 at 129,000 members and dropped to its low point at 70,000 members in 2016.
- FMCA has 76,700 members, 2210 are towables.
- MH production peaked at 71,800 in 2004 and bottomed at 13,200 in 2009.
- There were 427 FMCA chapters in 2014 and now it is down to 355, a problem which must be addressed.
- The \$9.4 million dollar budget was approved with a operating contingency of \$664,000.
- FMCA assist is \$603,000.
- Coaches over 10 years old are OK, as long as they are in good running order.

## FMCA Benefits

FMCA ASSIST is a valuable benefit included in your FMCA membership. Romer members Knud & Darline Bjornestad used this benefit earlier this year. Thanks to Jim, Susan, Debbie and Janet for helping out during this medical emergency.

You must first get to a hospital and then call FMCA assist (877-202- 4176) if there is a possibility that you will need help with transportation and arrangements. FMCA assist will help and pay for transportation of persons, MH's, tow vehicles, pets, etc. Like most insurance, you hope you never need it, but if you do, it could be a great benefit.

There are many other benefits such as Roadside assistance at a cost of \$69 per year. Check your FMCA magazine and FMCA online to see many more benefits.

# Plymouth Rally Golf



## Tech Talk with Jim McPheters



Castle Oaks Golf Club in Lone set the stage for our Plymouth rally golf tournament. After a great breakfast, six Romers turned out for a very enjoyable, but tough, day of golf. We had three two-man teams in competition, with four individual competitions. Even though the course was long and very challenging, the scramble format allowed everyone to have a fun day, while still contributing to the team event.

Although the teams essentially had equal handicaps, Team # 1 ham-and-egged it to come in with a 80; Team #2 edged Team #3 for second place by five strokes. The teams all did well on the front nine, but the back nine tested the mettle of all teams. The winning team was composed of Curt Curtis and Joe Dingman. Team #2 was composed of Dave Dixon and Garold Partin, with Team #3 made up of our Wagonmaster, Paul Klempner and Jim Lewis.

We had two closest-to-the-pin holes (# 11 & 16) and one longest drive hole (#7). Nobody even made the green on Hole # 11 but Joe Dingman was closest-to-the-pin on hole # 16 and the longest drive on hole # 7. We had hoped to have a few women golfers, so we had arranged for a longest drive for them on hole #12. Our Wagonmaster had a good drive on that hole and wanted credit; we gave him the dreaded "chicken" for claiming longest drive by a woman.

A great time was had by all, enjoying both the game and the friendship. Everyone is looking forward to the next competition. We hope more Romers can join us at future rallies. The primary objective is for the participants to have fun, regardless of skill level.

Dave Taylor reported that everything was working well on his coach, and that Final Touch Coach Works in Valencia did good work for him.

John Van Doren replaced his ice maker but is still having problems. He also had a **broken fuel line** on his engine with smoke coming from the engine compartment. Fix was inexpensive and quick. Discussion was also held regarding filling fuel tanks at stations using jacks to tilt the coach to ensure the tank is completely full.

Juan Marquez, Dave Taylor and Pat Coleman discussed **residential refrigerators** and solar power requirements. Ken Stender, Dave Taylor and Rob Wilson talked briefly about the location of the **water pump check valve** and replacing a plastic valve with a metal one.

Curt Curtis was having trouble with his **water hose not unwinding** on his coach. Rob mentioned a spring that may be in there. Others said they don't unwind their hose at all and just connect another hose to the one on the reel.

Members discussed the best **sequence for deploying slide outs** with different approaches used successfully without adverse effects. Opinions on **tire pressure monitoring systems** also varied.

**Toilet issues** ranged from bad fuses to slide valves needing lubrication. Thetford suggests lubing toilets once a year. Joe Dingman needs a toilet repair site in So Cal.

Dave Dixon had a door lock problem and also discovered that what he thought was an **out of round tire** was actually a tire that had been mounted incorrectly. He also mentioned his tranny temp seemed to get very high in stop and go traffic. Pat Coleman questioned the validity of the gauges and has set up his own set of gauges.

Pat also mentioned some air bag challenges he was having and that a **replacement valve had failed** and he recommended using OEM replacement valves. Hadley vs Chinese valve.

**General Business Meeting Minutes**  
*Pinot, Port, Plymouth, Placerville and Pie*  
*September 26, 2018*

Prior to the opening of the meeting, Web Master, Pat Coleman, presented a review of the new Monaco Romers' Web site and answered questions. The new site address is, [www.monacoromers.club](http://www.monacoromers.club). Pat was thanked for all the work that he did to get all of the information transferred and updated to the new site.

The meeting was called to order by President, Stephen Hobbs at 4:15 p.m.

Rob Wilson led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance and John VanDoren gave the Invocation.

The minutes were approved as presented in the Newsletter.

In the absence of the Treasurer, President Stephen gave the Treasurer's Report. He stated that the balance in the checking account is \$7,545.73 and in the savings, \$5,052.64 for a total of \$12,598.37. He noted that 60 cents had been earned in interest. Motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented and to file it for audit.

Duncan Holt thanked the current rally masters, Pat & Paul Klempner, Judy & Dale Edwards and Joanne & Jim McPheters, for all their hard work. He asked Susan Lewis to report on the January, 2019 Indio rally.

Susan stated that the registration form for the FMCA Indio rally is on their web site and in the FMCA magazine. The dates are January 9-13 but Monaco Romers can come in the Sunday before on January 6<sup>th</sup>. The Romers' application is on the Romer web site. She indicated the sites are 30 amp only so be sure and come with water tank full and black and grey water tanks empty. Once again Romers are driving the courtesy golf carts and Susan sent around a sign-up sheet for those attending and willing to drive a cart. The shifts are approximately 3 hours. She also noted they have a parade during the rally and shared ideas for the Romers to participate. The theme of the rally and parade being "Once Upon A Time." Wagonmasters are Jim & Susan Lewis, Rob & Dianne Wilson and Bob & Carolyn Bulot.

Duncan gave information on the Temecula Valley Rally since Wagonmasters Joann Bush & Bill Beckley and Don & Layne Strelic were not at this rally. The rally is scheduled for May 20-24, 2019 in the Pala Casino RV Resort. He also indicated they were considering an all day pre-rally wine tour on Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup> at a cost of \$120 each. Duncan handed out a preliminary brochure about the rally.

Duncan also reported on the rally scheduled for September 10-14, 2019 at the Wild Horse Resort in Pendleton, Oregon with Wagonmasters George & Linda McKiernan and Bill & G'Nell DeLack. This is during the Pendleton Round-up and a brochure was handed out.

Susan also gave information on tickets for the Grass Valley Draft Horse event on September 18-23, 2019

that could be attended on the way home from Oregon if interested. Tickets must be ordered early in April. Susan would be willing to purchase the tickets if you send in your check for tickets at \$85 each prior to April. Duncan reminded everyone that he is looking for volunteers as Wagonmasters for the 2020 rallies.

FMCA Director, Larry, gave his report. He attended the Monaco International pre-rally on July 11<sup>th</sup> and the 98<sup>th</sup> FMCA International Convention beginning July 18<sup>th</sup> in Gillette, Wyoming. There were 1,743 RV's attending the rally of which 217 were commercial and 497 were first timers. Eight Monaco Romer members attended the rallies. Larry also talked about the reduced membership. There are 355 chapters, down from 427 in 2014 and current membership is 76,700 from a peak of 129,000 in 2004. There is a great need to increase membership. He also discussed the many FMCA benefits especially commenting on FMCA ASSIST since our Romer members Knud & Darline Bjornestad used the benefit this year. He noted the many Rallies coming in 2019 including the FMCA Western Area Rally in Indio on January 6-13, and the Monaco International Rally in Las Vegas April 11-14.

Nancy gave a report on her first Newsletter and was thanked for all her great work.

Stephen read a letter of resignation from Rob Crow, Membership. In his letter he noted that he had been doing this job since 1999. Stephen asked for volunteers to fill this position and Marsha Taylor indicated she would be willing to do the job.

JoAnn Curtis gave the Sunshine Lady report. She is passing around cards to be signed by the members.

President Stephen brought forward a recommendation from the board with regard to clarification of Rule #3 on our Standing Rules. He noted that there was still some confusion with regard to the \$1500 stipend given to the Wagonmaster planning a rally and if that stipend is spent with each rally, the balance in our treasury would soon be depleted. For clarification he read the Rule as it now stands:

Rule # 3 currently reads, "Wagonmasters shall make their rallies self-supporting, if possible. The \$1500 *stipend* that is available for each rally is supposed to be spent. Any excess rally funds shall be returned to the Monaco Romers' Treasurer at the completion of the rally."

It is the board recommendation to **change the wording as follows: "Wagonmaster shall make their rallies self-supporting, if possible. The \$1500 *advance* that is available for each rally *is intended to be used for any expenses incurred prior to receipt of rally receipts.* Any excess rally funds shall be returned to the Monaco Romers Treasurer at the completion of the rally."** Upon motion made by Susan Lewis, on the above board recommendation, and seconded by Dennis Dee, the motion passed.

Stephen took this time to thank all the members that helped with the bar and a special thank you to our head bartender, Rob Wilson. Stephen also thanked Jim McPheters for his very helpful tech talk and again thanked all the rally planners for their hard work.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
